



#### Hercules Library and the City of Hercules

Hercules is a city-owned library, which means that the County and City share responsibility for the building, staffing, and collection. Contra Costa County supports a minimum of 40 hours of operation per library.



Contra Costa County also provides a collection that includes **one million items** available for physical checkout, over **four million** e-books and audiobooks, **35 electronic resources**, such as movies, newspapers and online learning tools.

### Hercules Library Collection = 44,892 items (Books, Audiobooks, Periodicals, Newspapers)

### **Other County Provided Resources**

- Library Administration, which includes back-of-the-house support for computing and networking equipment, hiring and retention, shipping through three delivery routes, budget and finance support, and programs and services designed to meet the specific needs of each community.
- Staffing. At Hercules Library, this includes one Senior Community Library Manger, two Librarians, two Library Assitants, two Clerks, eight part-time Library Aides.

 Computers/Technology and Support. 32 public computers, 5 self-check-out computers, 12 staff computers, 2 printer/copiers, 1 AWE station (children's educational games), 1 scanner.

## Hercules Library Funding – City

Above the base 40 hours paid for by Contra Costa County, the City of Hercules generously supports 6 additional open hours, bringing the total to 46 hours. We are open: Tuesday-Thursday 10am-8pm, Friday/Saturday 9am-5pm.

The City of Hercules is also responsible for facility upkeep, and over the past several years has supported major projects, such as:

- Greening the building's electricity as part of City Engie Energy Conservation Project, 2021
  - Updated library phones and phone systems, 2022
  - Hiring KleenTech janitorial services as part of City buildings project, 2023
    - Fixed the Starry Cone flooding/leak, 2024
    - Updated the library fireplace with a beautiful safety screen, 2024
    - Updated/fixed library HVAC so the library properly heats/cools, 2024


### **Contra Costa County Library Funding - Federal**

Contra Costa County Library receives very little federal funding. Some federal funds supplement the Library Department's offerings via resources provided by the State Library to all public libraries in California at no cost. These resources include hundreds of free trainings for library staff annually (CALL Academy) and New York Times subscription access for all library card holders (a savings of approximately \$35,000 annually). Additionally, the Library receives federal e-rate reimbursements annually. E-rate provides deep discounts for Internet access.

The library receives approximately \$118,000 annually in reimbursements. Other than those relatively very small amounts, our revenue is derived entirely from local property taxes and extra hours funding from our city partners.

### Contra Costa County Library Funding – County

Contra Costa County Libraries are funded by 1.5% of the 1% County ad valorem property tax.

You can check out and learn to play ukulele, take home a wifi hotspot, learn to code with Raspberry Pi, take home an Outdoor Explorer backpack & visit a State Park or explore a local museum/garden/attraction thanks to Discover and Go.

## Funding Support – The Friends of the Hercules Library & The Hercules Library Foundation

Based soley on donations and book sales at the Bookstore and two annual book sales, The Friends of the Hercules Library support:

- <u>All</u> Hercules Library Programs Hercules Library held **364 programs in 2024** and the Friends support totaled **\$12,360**.
- Books for Hercules Collection \$14,000 anually

Based solely on donations from the community, the Hercules Library Foundation pays for:

- Annual Furniture Cleaning est. **\$1600** to clean the upholstered sofas, chairs, and rugs
- Aunt Flow Period Products **\$1540** to install four dispeners, **\$150** for period product refills in 2024, and **\$1084** for refills in 2025.
- Burgeon Interactive Play Stars & Planets, for the Starry Cone **\$3411** in 2024 for the final star in our galaxy.
- New shelving for the YA room **\$1500** in 2025.
- Other Library hardware requests as necessary.


