The City retains the discretion whether to add items to the agenda. Persons wishing to address the Commission otherwise may make comments during the Public Communication period of the meeting.

AGENDA POSTING: Agendas of regular commission meetings are posted at least 72 hours prior to the meeting at City Hall, the Hercules Swim Center, Ohlone Child Care Center, Hercules Post Office, and on the City's website (www.ci.hercules.ca.us),

PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS: Persons who wish to address the Commission should complete the speaker form prior to the Commission's consideration of the item on the agenda.

Anyone who wishes to address the Commission on a topic that is not on the agenda and is relevant to the Commission should complete the speaker form prior to the start of the meeting. Speakers will be called upon during the Public Communication portion of the meeting. In accordance with the Brown Act, the Commission may not take action on items not listed on the agenda. The Commission may refer to staff any matters brought before them at this time and those matters may be placed on a future agenda.

In the interests of conducting an orderly and efficient meeting, speakers will be limited to three (3) minutes.

Anyone may also submit written comments at any time before or during the meeting.

Written and oral comments become part of the public record. Oral comments are summarized in the minutes of the commission's meeting.

CONSENT CALENDAR: All matters listed under Consent Calendar are considered to be routine and will be enacted by one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless requested by a member of the Commission or a member of the public prior to the time the Commission votes on the motion to adopt.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS: This is the time for brief announcements by commissioners on issues of interests to the community. In accordance with provisions of the Brown Act, matters which do not appear on the agenda, but require Commission discussion may be either (a) referred to staff or other resources for factual information or (b) placed on a future meeting agenda.

LEGAL CHALLENGES: If you challenge a decision of the Commission in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the meeting or in written correspondence delivered at, or prior to, the meeting. Actions challenging Commission decisions shall be subject to the time limitations contained in Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6. 

Project/Program: Parks & Recreation Department Activities
Lead Staff: Christopher Roke, Parks & Recreation Director

Description: The Parks and Recreation Department leads and/or is involved with many community activities and events all year long. We also collect fees for various classes and services provided to the community.

Status: In October 2018 the department brought in **\$125,269.66** in revenue. Year to Date Revenue for Fiscal Year 2017-18 is **\$557,237.41** (on track with last year same time).

Accomplishments/Items in Progress:

- Trunk or Treat/Movie success: October 26 at the Community Center. Approximately 150-200 people participated in the event. The event was a HIT!
- Wall Mounted Basketball Units are up and being used at the Community Center.
- Working on several projects Council approved decision packages for 2018-19FY...
 - ✓ DP#19-2: Golf Club Fund: Youth programs purchased equipment
 - ✓ DP#19-7: Painting the exterior of the Senior Center completed.
 - o DP#19-10: Upgrades to the Van Domselaar Room at Samara Terrace.
 - o DP#19-11: New chairs and tables for the Community Centers.
 - o DP#19-12: Hanna Kidz Center improvements.
 - DP#19-13: A new permanent stage for the Community Center
 ✓ DP#19-14: VFD's (variable frequency drives) for the pool pumps installed.
 - o BR#19-2: Technology upgrades to the Teen Center.
 - o BR#19-14: Resurface the Refugio Valley Tennis Courts.
 - o BR#19-15: New chairs for the Library.
 - ✓ BR#19-18: Donation to Robotics Club at HHS completed.
- School started again. Fall programs started with a bang.
- Summer Movie Series Success: Wonder, Coco, The Last Airbender and Star Wars.
- Increased enrollment in our city Summer Camp programs again.
- 2018 Fall Activity Guide was mailed out to every household end of July.

Project/Program: Community & Library Services Commission
Lead Staff: Christopher Roke, Parks & Recreation Director

Description: The Community and Library Services Commission went dark in August. The Commission began hearing reports from the Nonprofit groups in September and October. The remaining groups will give their presentations in November.

Status: The Commission spent time last FY updating the Nonprofit renewal packet for City Recognized Nonprofit groups. In addition, the Commission spent time last year working on community outreach regarding the west side parks improvements project, input for the Library's tenth anniversary celebration, a permanent display space at the Hercules Library for the Hercules Historical Society, mural preservation, City recognized nonprofit organizations, continual





evaluation of Parks & Recreation Programs, the Citywide Clean-up Day and approval of new plaques for the heritage garden.

Accomplishments/Items in Progress:

- Trunk or Treat was held at the Community Center on October 26. There were approximately 150-200 total participants. Overall it was a great success.
- Duck Pond Park has the bathroom installed. The contractor is working on the court, benches, ½ fence, and landscaping. The project will be done in November.
- Holiday Tree Lighting event will be on Sunday, December 2, at the Community Center.
- The new flooring in Foxboro Community Center was completed on June 7.

Project/Program: Hanna/Lupine/Ohlone Childcare & Summer Day Camps

Lead Staff: Ambra Garfield, Recreation Manager

Description: This time of the year is always fun. We are at the beginning of the new fiscal year, we are in the middle of summer, and we are gearing up for the start of the new school year. So it is always a busy time.

Breakfast Club was the hit of 2017-18! Breakfast Club featured earlier hours (opening at 6:30a), and breakfast options (hot and cold food/drink options available for purchase). Parents were extremely happy with the program. And using the Teen Center instead of the schools allowed us to cut back the number of staff necessary to run the morning and after school programs which also saved the City money. The Breakfast Club has a maximum limit based on the number of seats in our Vans.

Kaleidoscope Kidz: Recreation Afterschool Program (or RAP for short), is our after school program. We successfully rebranded the name bringing greater focus on homework, and a station rotation curriculum with P.E. to make sure the kidz are active. RAP focuses on monthly themes that featured a combination of arts and crafts, science, cooking, passive and active games and much more. RAP is held at all 3 elementary sites. The name of the facilities changed to "Kidz Center", to compliment the Kaleidoscope Kidz program.

The current challenge that we face for all of our programs this fall is our lack of staffing. We have been able to recently get 3 new staff on board, but we are still lower than we'd like in terms of staffing numbers. The 2017-18FY saw a very successful rebranding effort with our before and after school programs.

Status: In October 2018 Child Care programs brought in a total of **\$61,958.66** in revenue.

- Child Care is enjoying an increase in enrollment for the 2018-19 school year.
 - Lupine has a waiting list. We were able to open an additional class of TK/K.
- The new school year saw an increase in last minute Child Care registration.





- o In August, we had one of our largest months ever with enrollment and revenue.
- Camp Dynamite has been successful this summer. The numbers are comparable to last summer when we increased enrollment, and this is without the 5th graders. We moved the 5th graders into the Teen Camp program to accommodate the youngest age group that exploded this past FY.

Project/Program: Tiny Tots Programs-Little Learners/Pre-Kinder/Jr. Kinder

Lead Staff: Ambra Garfield, Recreation Manager

Description: The Tiny Tots Programs introduce children to their "First Learning Experiences". They make their first school friends, learning through play, games, arts, crafts and healthy snacks. Our qualified staff will guide them with socialization and self-help skills. The program runs concurrent with the school year from late August through June. Tiny Tots began at the end of August.

Status: In October 2018 Tiny Tot Programs brought in \$16,732.15 in revenue.

Accomplishments/Items in Progress:

- Hanna Preschool had been dealing with a flea problem in September and October. After trying a myriad of things, we believe the issue has been resolved.
- Numbers increased in the LL and PK classes. Both started out low. There is still space.
- Good news/bad news: the new Aide that started in October, is leaving due to a family emergency. We continue to struggle to keep staff.
- Like child care, preschool picked up as the calendar hit August.
- Added additional classes in anticipation of growing program.

Project/Program: Aquatics

Lead Staff: Austin George, Recreation Coordinator

Description: The Aquatics program encompasses a lot of different programs, from seasonal swim lessons, to lap swimming, water walking, rec swim, lifeguarding courses, and of course Swim and Water Polo Teams including: the East Bay Silver Dolphins (EBSD), the Piranhas, and Hercules High School Swim and Water Polo teams.

Status: In October 2018 Aquatics brought in \$10,792 in revenue.

1. Nonprofit Group Presentation – (WCCYSL) West Contra Costa Youth Soccer League

George Dias, President of WCCYSL, made the presentation. WCCYSL began providing organized youth soccer here in 1983. WCCYSL provides practices, games and clinics. They also have a large ref program as well. Over the past 2 years the numbers for WCCYSL have been up. There are over 170 Hercules families are involved with youth soccer. WCCYSL also reported that half of their refs and 15 coaches live here as well. They have children between the ages of 4 and 14, with over 450 total players in the league, which includes 8 travel teams that go all over the Bay Area.

WCCSL participates in the annual Tree Lighting event, as well as the Citywide Clean Up day. Their members also put in lots of hours annually at the Hanna Ranch Soccer field.

Opening day has become a big deal where they get over 600 people in attendance. They have combined opening day with photos and games in an "all in one" type of event, complete with food vendors. They are part of a Coaches Alliance, that promotes a positive atmosphere as well as hold several referee classes annually for those 14 and up. All of their refs are paid.

2. Nonprofit Group Presentation – Friends of Hercules Library
Charlie Lucy presented for the Friends of the Hercules Library. The Friends of the
Hercules Library (FOHL) formed in May of 2000, with the goal of contributing to the
quality of life. To extend and enhance the Library Services.

Membership for the FOHL is open to everyone. There are currently over 200 active members. They hold 2 book sales annually, to help raise money for the Library. The next Book Sale is November 3 & 4. The money generated is to help the Library to build, as well as to help make special purchases. They raised \$24,000 in 2017, of which, half went to the purchase of new books, and the other half went towards enhancements in the Library. To date, the FOHL has raised more than \$250 thousand dollars.

FOHL regularly participates in the Clean Up day as well as the annual Tree Lighting, but has also participated in planning meetings for the Tree Lighting. This year they will also participate in the upcoming Trunk or Treat event.
