Recycling Goals

 Statewide goal for 75% disposal reduction by the year 2020

Processing History

- Most recyclable materials were shipped to China and other Asian Countries
- Allowed 5-6% non-recyclable contamination depending on the grade of material and buyer
- Effective 1/1/2018, allowable contamination was reduced to .5% or less per load





GLOBAL MARKETING IMPACT...

- International secondary processors for remanufacturing are rejecting contaminated loads
- Collection companies accepting fewer plastic and paper materials
- U.S. sorting facilities going out of business
- Potential for recyclable materials going to landfill



WHAT'S HAPPENING IN WEST COUNTY NOW?

- Recycling carts used for garbage-for instance:
 - Soiled diapers
 - Kitty litter, dog waste
 - Food scraps
 - Shoes, clothing
 - E-waste, Universal waste
 - Construction debris
 - Other materials not accepted in curbside collection
- Cart contamination levels in West County range from 15% to 45%.













WHAT DO WE DO NOW?

- Take personal responsibility
 - Keep trash out of recycling
 - Put materials in the right cart




- Empty, Clean, Dry
- Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!





WHAT IS REPUBLIC SERVICES DOING TO HELP?

- Continued community outreach
 - Service collection guides—Do's and Don'ts on:
 - Garbage, trash
 - Recycling
 - Organics—food scraps, yard waste
 - Special services—HHW, bulky household items, etc.
 - Quarterly Newsletter
 - "Customer call blast" of important service changes.
 - Website additions and expansion underway
 - Community/school presentations
- Conducting cart contamination audits to:
 - Understand extent/types of contamination
 - Educate on materials separation
 - Improve customer compliance
 - Protect worker and public health and safety





CURRENT CONTAMINATION AUDIT PROCESS

- Throughout West Contra Costa County
- Two-person teams
- Visually inspecting carts
- Photograph contents of contaminated carts
- Notice (Oops!!) tags left on contaminated carts:
 - Type of contamination
 - Notice there will be a Surcharge*
 - Contact phone number for information or to question the Contamination Surcharge

Option 1	Option 2
CONTINUE CART AUDITS	AUDIT, TAG AND LEAVE CART UNSERVICED

OPTION 1: CONTINUE CART AUDITS (REPUBLIC SERVICES' RECOMMENDED OPTION)

Plan:

- Audit recycling carts
- Service all carts
- Place notice of \$27.75 surcharge on contaminated carts, and
- Include contact phone number on notice for information, or to question surcharge

Impact:

- Operationally efficient
- Cost effective
- Keeps streets cleaner; enhances neighborhood aesthetics
- Protects public health
- Preserves dwindling landfill space
- Provides person-to-person educational and surcharge discussion opportunities
- Least burdensome and costly to non-complying customers
- Accountability for noncompliance

Option 2: Tag and Leave Cart Unserviced

Plan:

- Audit recycling carts
- Tag and leave contaminated carts unserviced
- Customer choice to:
 - Clean cart and call for collection (\$32.01 Return Trip Fee)
 - Clean cart, hold over waste and recyclables for next week collection

<u>Impact:</u>

- More costly to non-complying customers than Option 1 (Audit, Tag and Collect) Contamination Surcharge (currently \$27.75)
- Hold over likely to result in overage in solid waste cart with overage fee—or unlawful dumping
- Causes blight to the detriment of neighborhood residents
- Unnecessarily exposes residents to biological pathogens

Approximately 1300-1500 carts audited on 3 different recycling routes

252 - Recycling carts containing trash were tagged

74 - One-time Surcharge credits provided to customers with first time contamination that responded with a call to our Customer Service Office

178 – Number of customers who paid the contamination surcharge

2019:

Due to weather, approximately 200-300 audits done on 1 recycling route

13 - Recycling carts containing trash were tagged

1 - One-time Surcharge credits provided to customers with first time contamination that responded with a call to our Customer Service Office
