AGENDA POSTING: Agendas of regular commission meetings are posted at least 72 hours prior to the meeting at City Hall, the Hercules Swim Center, Ohlone Child Care Center, Hercules Post Office, and on the City's website (www.ci.hercules.ca.us),

PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS: Persons who wish to address the Commission should complete the speaker form prior to the Commission's consideration of the item on the agenda.

Anyone who wishes to address the Commission on a topic that is not on the agenda and is relevant to the Commission should complete the speaker form prior to the start of the meeting. Speakers will be called upon during the Public Communication portion of the meeting. In accordance with the Brown Act, the Commission may not take action on items not listed on the agenda. The Commission may refer to staff any matters brought before them at this time and those matters may be placed on a future agenda.

In the interests of conducting an orderly and efficient meeting, speakers will be limited to three (3) minutes.

Anyone may also submit written comments at any time before or during the meeting.

Project/Program: Parks & Recreation Department Activities
Lead Staff: Christopher Roke, Parks & Recreation Director

Description: The Parks and Recreation Department leads and/or is involved with many community activities and events all year long. We also collect fees for various classes and services provided to the community.

Status: In October 2019 the department brought in **\$138,201.83** in revenue. Year to Date Revenue for Fiscal Year 2019-20 is **\$648,924.08**. Tracking ahead of the past 2 years.

Project/Program: Community & Library Services Commission
Lead Staff: Christopher Roke, Parks & Recreation Director

Description: The Community and Library Services Commission went dark in August. But September through November will be busy months with presentations from the 14 City recognized Nonprofit groups. Applications for the 2020FY will also be due in November, and the Commission will vote on applications at the December meeting.

Status: The Commission spent time updating the Nonprofit renewal packet for City Recognized Nonprofit groups in 2017 & 2018. The biggest change in 2018 was the addition of the 1099 Tax form for each group. In addition, the Commission reviewed the banner program and got to see the completion of the west side parks improvements project. The City recognized nonprofit organizations will participate in upcoming events like the 2nd annual Trunk or Treat event, Tree Lighting and the Citywide Clean-up Day.

Project/Program: Hanna/Lupine/Ohlone Childcare & Summer Day Camps

Lead Staff: Ambra Garfield, Recreation Manager

Description: Childcare and Camps are a big deal in Hercules. We offer a great before school option called "Breakfast Club", and an amazing after school program called "Kaleidoscope Kidz: Recreation Afterschool Program (or RAP for short), and fantastic summer camps called "Camp Firecracker" and "Camp Dynamite".

Camp Dynamite: was held at the Lupine Kidz Center this summer. There were 9 weeks of camp featuring weekly entertainment, field trips, games, cooking, arts and crafts, weekly themes, swimming, Jamin' Jeanne's games galore and more. Camp was split in to 2 age groups with Firecrackers (grades K-2nd) and Dynamite (grades 3rd-5th). Dynamite campers went on 4 big field trips along with the Teen Dynamite Camp. Below are a few highlights this summer as well as a week by week glance of the numbers...

- Averaged between 75-80 campers per week.
- Favorite activities included field trips, swimming at the Community Center, and the walking field trip to the library for story time and to check out books.

Breakfast Club: features earlier hours (open 6:30am), and breakfast (hot or cold food & drink options - available for purchase). Parents (and participants) love the program for the convenience! This is part of our concierge service to the community. This fall, we opened another site, offering Breakfast Club at Ohlone Community Center. The trend has shown us that we needed more space for Ohlone kids. By opening Ohlone Community Center, we are able to increase the number of participants. It also allows us to stay later at the Breakfast Club site, which is reducing the number of staff needed in the morning.

Kaleidoscope Kidz: Recreation Afterschool Program (or **RAP** for short), is our after school program. After a successful rebranding of the after school program, the focus has become more about homework, and stations. The stations include P.E. to keep the kidz active. RAP focuses on





monthly themes that featured a combination of arts and crafts, science, cooking, passive and active games and much more. RAP is held at all 3 elementary sites. The current challenge that we face for all of our programs is our lack of staffing. We have very few spaces available for the Rap program. Two of our Afterschool programs are full with waiting lists.

Status: In October Child Care programs brought in a total of \$61,692.36 in revenue.

Accomplishments/Items in Progress:

- The new school year programs are already getting impacted and we still have 3 weeks until school begins.
 - o August has become one of our largest months for enrollment and revenue and we anticipate the same thing this year.
- Another successful summer with the Camp program. Camp Firecracker and Camp Dynamite numbers are up a little compared to last summer.

Project/Program: Tiny Tots Programs-Little Learners/Pre-Kinder/Jr. Kinder

Lead Staff: Ambra Garfield, Recreation Manager

Description: Our Tiny Tots Program introduces children to their "First Learning Experiences". They make their first school friends, learn through play, games, arts, crafts and healthy snacks. Our qualified staff guide them with socialization and self-help skills. The program runs concurrent with the school year from late August through June. Tiny Tots began at the end of August.

Status: In October Tiny Tot Programs brought in **\$22,094.10** in revenue.

- Numbers increased in the LL and PK classes. Both started low, but now only 1 spot left.
- Good news/bad news: the new Aide that started in October, is leaving due to a family emergency. We continue to struggle to keep staff.
- Like child care, preschool picked up as the calendar hit August.
- Added additional classes in anticipation of growing program.

Project/Program: Aquatics

Lead Staff: Damian Sandholm - Recreation Coordinator

Description: The Aquatics program encompasses a lot of different programs, from seasonal swim lessons, to lap swimming, water walking, rec swim, lifeguarding courses, and of course Swim and Water Polo Teams including: the East Bay Silver Dolphins (EBSD), the Piranhas, and Hercules High School Swim and Water Polo teams.

Status: In October Aquatics brought in \$10,406.50 in revenue.

X. DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION ITEMS

1. Nonprofit Group Presentation – Sister City – Lynn Fissell gave report Membership: Open to all residents of Hercules.

Residency: The number of dues-paying members, as of the most recent renewal period of January 1, 2019 – December 31, 2019 is 12 families and 2 individuals. The percentage of those who are Hercules residents, own a Hercules-based business, or are an employee of a Hercules-based business is 100%.

Community Involvement (80 hours or more doing the following activities):

- Fund-Raising and information distribution:
 - CityWide Garage Sale April 28, 2019
 - CityWide Garage Sale September 28, 2019
 - Hercules Fourth of July event booth demonstrating and selling origami items as well as popular images decals – July 4, 2019
 - Solicitation of donations from local businesses/organizations
- Participation in Clean-Up Day in Hercules: Two HSCA members participated in this event that was held on May 4, 2019 at the City's corporation yard dumpsters.
- Visit to Tsushima by the Hercules Friendship Delegation: Eight student Youth Ambassadors and four adult chaperones (including City Manager David Biggs representing the City of Hercules for the first time in ten years) made the trip to Tsushima and other cities in Japan that began on July 24, 2019 and ended August 4, 2019. Japanese language and customs classes for the Youth Ambassadors were conducted beginning in late March 2019 and extended until July 17, 2019.
- Visit to Hercules by the Tsushima Friendship Delegation: Planning will begin soon for the visit by eight students and two adults in early August 2020. Host families will be sought to show them hospitality and take them to places in and around Hercules. The City of Hercules will participate in whatever way it can.
- Hercules Holiday Tree Lighting event: Eight HSCA members participated in the Hercules Holiday Tree Lighting event that was held on December 2, 2018 at which the demonstration of origami was conducted. Also, snack items were distributed along with informational brochures about our organization. A collage of photographs of the 2017 Japan trip was available for viewing. HSCA members intend to participate in the event on December 1, 2019.
- Progress report of 2018 activities: Attended the Community and Library Services Commission meeting on September 10, 2018 to give a status report.
- The Consulate General of Japan at its San Francisco office: Created the California-Japan Sister Cities Network (CJSCN) to bring together sister cities for mutual benefit. This organization produces a monthly newsletter and organizes quarterly meetings.
- 2. Nonprofit Group Presentation Historical Society Lynn Fissell gave report Membership: Open to all residents of Hercules.

Residency: The number of dues-paying members, as of the most recent renewal period of June 1, 2018 – July 31, 2019 is 19 individuals. The percentage of those who are Hercules residents, own a Hercules-based business, or are an employee of a Hercules-based business is 89%.

Community Involvement (80 hours or more doing the following activities):

- Collecting artifacts/photographs: HHS accepted donations of artifacts and photographs from the families of several former Hercules Powder Plant employees and others with ties to the community. This activity occurs year-round and is done by any of the HHS members on an as-needed basis.
- Historical resource: Reponses to several inquiries seeking guidance about matters related to the former Hercules Powder Company were provided to the requesters.
- Web site and artifact inventory: A major overhaul of its web site (http://www.herculeshistory.org) is underway. New technology is making it easier to provide public access to digital files such as photographs, documents, and audio & video recordings. This activity is being done in order to make it possible to include photographs of its artifact inventory that will involve special software. An Instagram account has been created and will include content that has yet to be decided upon.
- Hercules Library exhibit: A new exhibit called "Kaboom" was installed in the designated lockable cabinet in the Hercules Library. The installation took place in late June 2019.
- Participation in the Hercules Holiday Tree Lighting event held on December 2, 2018: Three HHS members manned an information table at which they answered questions about Hercules history and the organization. HHS brochures and snacks were distributed to those who visited the table. Due to scheduling conflicts, no HHS members will be participating in an information table at the event scheduled for December 1, 2019.
- Participation in Clean-Up Day in Hercules held on May 4, 2019: Five HHS members worked at the event at the City's corporation yard dumpsters.
- Attended the Community and Library Services Commission meeting on September 10, 2018 to give a status report.
- 3. Nonprofit Group Presentation Library Foundation Jo Ellen Marcotte gave report During 2019, the Hercules Library Foundation continued our mission of soliciting and managing contributions to supplement public funding for the Hercules Library. Our goal is to ensure that the library continues to provide outstanding free and convenient services for our community.

On April 17, we hosted our annual volunteer event at the library to thank everyone for their hard work and dedication. Approximately 40 volunteers shared dinner, played games and received certificates for their work.

On May 4, we participated in the city wide clean-up day.

During this year, the Foundation purchased additional toys and a deck box to store them in the Children's outdoor garden.

In 2019, the Foundation made its final payment of \$13,000 to the City of Hercules for additional library operating hours.

Also, we authorized spending up to \$15,000 for the renovation of the Story Cone in the Children's library. The library staff has been working with the Burgeon Group to design an all inclusive early literacy and play space with a spaceship/space theme. The installation was completed on October 5. It includes wall panels and early literacy manipulatives which elevate the space into an interactive, educational and safe area for younger children of all abilities and needs. We are planning a grand opening "Launch Party" on October 15 which will be open to the public.

We have also been working with the library staff to secure grant money to help pay for this exciting and important project.

Throughout 2019, a number of our Board of directors and officers continued to perform various volunteer duties at the library such as shelving books and teaching classes.

- 4. Nonprofit Group Presentation Friends of the Library Charlie Lucke gave report We are a nonprofit 501(c)3 organization that was formed in May 2000 to support the effort to bring a library to our city. The Friends believe that the Hercules Library is a valuable resource that enriches our city and contributes to its quality of life. Our aims are to:
 - Support, promote, and advocate for the library as a vital community asset
 - Extend and enhance the library's services and resources
 - Establish close relations between the library and the people it serves

Membership in the Friends is open to all. We currently have more than 200 members.

Our volunteers operate a bookstore inside the Hercules Library, run an online book sales program, and hold used book sales twice a year. The money we raise through these activities, as well as donations and membership dues, are used to:

- Provide funds to help the library build its collections of books and other materials
- Sponsor programs and activities to entertain and educate both children and adults
- Assist the library staff with special purchases and projects

In 2018, our financial contribution to the library was more than \$20,000. Of this amount, \$10,000 was designated for new books and materials, and \$10,000 more went to support and enhance the library's programs and services. We anticipate similar totals for 2019, which will bring the total amount that we have donated to the library since

our founding to more than \$270,000.

We also promote and publicize the library to the community. We regularly participate in such events as community expos, the holiday tree lighting celebration, and the Community Cleanup Day.

We look forward to a great 2020 for our library and for the city of Hercules.

5. Trunk or Treat

The 2nd annual Trunk or Treat event is coming up Friday, October 25. It will be held at the Community Swim Center. We will start at 6pm, and go until 8pm or until candy runs out...whichever comes first. In 2018 we had 14 cars participate in decorating their car trunks and handing out candy to approximately 75costumed Trick or Treaters. Our goal for this year is to have between 15 and 18 cars, and we anticipate about 150-200 participants.

As previously reported, Trunk or Treat is a relatively new alternative to the traditional door to door Trick or Treating that happens on Halloween. This year the Parks and Recreation Department will once again be putting our spin on this fun community event, by showing a Halloween themed movie. We have Police, Fire, several city recognized nonprofit groups, city staff and community members coming to help out. We are also excited to announce that Starbucks will be there as well as about a half dozen volunteers from the Kiwin and Interact Clubs.

It's not too late to enter your trunk into our event. We have great prizes this year, and we think it will be a "Spook-tacular" event. If you are interested in participating as one of the vehicles, please contact the Parks and Recreation Department at (510) 799-8291.
