Public Hearing Appeal of Planning Commission's Approval of Bayfront Blocks M-O-P Design Review Permit #19-01 (continued from City Council meeting of July 9, 2019)

Recommendation: Continue the public hearing from July 9, 2019, to modify Reversing the Planning Commission's Resolution #19-03 approving Design Review Permit #19-01 and its related environmental determination for Bayfront Blocks M, O, and P to allow Hercules Development Partners, LP/Ledcor Corporation to construct 473 apartments (including 30 affordable housing units) and related amenities in three structures up to six stories tall, with 552 on-site parking spaces, on a portion of Assessor Parcel Number 404-730-005-0.

City Manager Biggs introduced the item and provided a staff report.

Mayor Romero opened the continued public hearing at 7:39 p.m.

City Council discussed the proposed MOU and expressed concerns. There was a consensus among the Council Members to delete the MOU in it's entirety and just incorporate language into the conditions of approval which addresses the City Council's concerns regarding having an implementation agreement or a public parking district established prior to the issuance of building permits or by October 31, 2020, whichever occurs first.

Mayor Romero recommended modifications to the Resolution and to delete all language related to the proposed MOU and to amend Section 2 on page 2 of the Resolution. Mayor Romero closed the continued public hearing at 7:55 p.m. with no comments offered from the public.

City Council provided a list of questions identified below to be incorporated as the study is further developed.

- 1) Table 3 of the parking report needs to better define the developer's proposal.
- 2) Ask developer's to substantiate how they determined 10% shared parking.
- 3) Look at 5% increments of what additional shared parking would provide in the study.
- 4) Look at options of flex-space used as listed in the EIR.
- 5) Look at the impact if less or additional restaurant business was used to develop the shared parking number.

- 6) Incorporate the use of Uber and Lyft.
- 7) Actively reach out to Mr. Curry for his input into the study.
- 8) Clarify if 2 per 1,000 or 3/1,000 was used in assumed parking for non-residential.
- 9) Clarify how the visitor portion is being handled as part of the 176 spaces being offered as shared parking.
