



Project/Program: Parks & Recreation Department Activities

**Description:** The Parks and Recreation Department leads and/or is involved with many community activities and events all year long. We also collect fees for various classes and services provided to the community.

**Status:** In October 2019 the department brought in **\$138,201.83** in revenue. Year to Date Revenue for Fiscal Year 2019-20 is **\$648,924.08**. Tracking ahead of the past 2 years.

Project/Program: Community & Library Services Commission

**Description:** The Community and Library Services Commission went dark in August. But September through November will be busy months with presentations from the 14 City recognized Nonprofit groups. Applications for the 2020FY will also be due in November, and the Commission will vote on applications at the December meeting.

**Status:** The Commission spent time updating the Nonprofit renewal packet for City Recognized Nonprofit groups in 2017 & 2018. The biggest change in 2018 was the addition of the 1099 Tax form for each group. In addition, the Commission reviewed the banner program and got to see the completion of the west side parks improvements project. The City recognized nonprofit organizations will participate in upcoming events like the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Trunk or Treat event, Tree Lighting and the Citywide Clean-up Day.

Project/Program: Hanna/Lupine/Ohlone Childcare & Summer Day Camps

**Description:** Childcare and Camps are a big deal in Hercules. We offer a great before school option called "Breakfast Club", and an amazing after school program called "Kaleidoscope Kidz: Recreation Afterschool Program (or RAP for short), and fantastic summer camps called "Camp Firecracker" and "Camp Dynamite".

**Camp Dynamite**: was held at the Lupine Kidz Center this summer. There were 9 weeks of camp featuring weekly entertainment, field trips, games, cooking, arts and crafts, weekly themes, swimming, Jamin' Jeanne's games galore and more. Camp was split in to 2 age groups with Firecrackers (grades K-2<sup>nd</sup>) and Dynamite (grades 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>). Dynamite campers went on 4 big field trips along with the Teen Dynamite Camp. Below are a few highlights this summer as well as a week by week glance of the numbers...

- Averaged between 75-80 campers per week.
- Favorite activities included field trips, swimming at the Community Center, and the walking field trip to the library for story time and to check out books.

**Breakfast Club:** features earlier hours (open 6:30am), and breakfast (hot or cold food & drink options - available for purchase). Parents (and participants) love the program for the convenience! This is part of our concierge service to the community. This fall, we opened another site, offering Breakfast Club at Ohlone Community Center. The trend has shown us that we needed more space for Ohlone kids. By opening Ohlone Community Center, we are able to increase the number of participants. It also allows us to stay later at the Breakfast Club site, which is reducing the number of staff needed in the morning.

**Kaleidoscope Kidz: Recreation Afterschool Program** (or **RAP** for short), is our after school program. After a successful rebranding of the after school program, the focus has become more about homework, and stations. The stations include P.E. to keep the kidz active. RAP focuses on





monthly themes that featured a combination of arts and crafts, science, cooking, passive and active games and much more. RAP is held at all 3 elementary sites. The current challenge that we face for all of our programs is our lack of staffing. We have very few spaces available for the Rap program. Two of our Afterschool programs are full with waiting lists.

**Status:** In October Child Care programs brought in a total of \$61,692.36 in revenue.

Project/Program: Tiny Tots Programs-Little Learners/Pre-Kinder/Jr. Kinder

**Description:** Our Tiny Tots Program introduces children to their "First Learning Experiences". They make their first school friends, learn through play, games, arts, crafts and healthy snacks. Our qualified staff guide them with socialization and self-help skills. The program runs concurrent with the school year from late August through June. Tiny Tots began at the end of August.

**Status:** In October Tiny Tot Programs brought in **\$22,094.10** in revenue.

**Description:** The Aquatics program encompasses a lot of different programs, from seasonal swim lessons, to lap swimming, water walking, rec swim, lifeguarding courses, and of course Swim and Water Polo Teams including: the East Bay Silver Dolphins (EBSD), the Piranhas, and Hercules High School Swim and Water Polo teams.

Status: In October Aquatics brought in \$10,406.50 in revenue.

Project/Program: Facilities/Rentals

**Description:** The City of Hercules offers many of the City's facilities for rent when not being used for City sponsored programs or services. Facility attendants also prepare facilities for the department's classes and city meetings.

**Status:** In October, facility rentals brought in \$15,333.25 in revenue.
