1. 21-039 Continued Public Hearing Regarding Zoning Text Amendment #20-03: City Ordinance to update Municipal Code Section 13-35-320 to address changes in State housing law affecting local regulation of Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs)

**Recommendation:** Open the continued public hearing, take public testimony, waive the first reading, and approve the introduction of

Ordinance No. 531 amending Hercules Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 35 "Specific Land Use Requirements" to update the City's current policies and processes for accessory dwelling units (ADU's) for conformity with current State law.

City Manager Biggs introduced the item. Community Development Director Reber and Assistant City Attorney Crowl provided a staff report and an update on this item since the last public hearing. Members of the City Council asked questions and provided comments.
